Workshops should combine a focus on skill development, and underlying theory and research that can be incorporated into practice around: updated family law issues, child development and family dynamics, alienation issues, CPS involvement, mental health issues, innovative ADR/Parenting Coordination/Facilitation, unmarried/single parent family issues, drug and alcohol issues, parent education, and other services available to these families. We invite proposals from the bar, bench, and various service providers. We hope to offer national, statewide, and local perspectives.

The Texas Chapter of AFCC and UH Law Center Clinical Program invites **75-minute workshop session** proposals including, but not limited to, the topics listed above. To submit a workshop proposal, please include the following information: 1) an abstract of 200 words or less describing your proposed workshop; 2) a workshop title and a “program ready” abstract of up to 80 words for the conference brochure; 3) a one-page outline of your proposed workshop; 4) three learning objectives addressed by your proposed workshop; 5) résumés and/or curriculum vita and complete contact information for all proposed presenters (name, address, phone/fax numbers, and email addresses for each); 6) name of the coordinator for your workshop; and 7) contact information for two professional references.

Please note that the deadline for receipt of proposals is **May 28, 2010 at 5:00 pm CST**. The Texas Chapter of AFCC and UH Law Center Clinical Program are unable to guarantee consideration of incomplete or late proposals. The Texas Chapter of AFCC and UH Law Center Clinical Program will offer a reduced registration rate for conference presenters, but are unable to reimburse travel and related expenses.
